

SAFETY STANDARDS FOR EVENTS

Sanitizing and Decontaminating

All used areas by guests, staff, cast and crew will be sanitized after every event, including powered aerosol on seats, wiping handrails, handles, elevators, rest rooms and other surfaces that may have been touched. Air handling equipment in the facility has been fitted with filters that lower COVID-19 contamination. Rest rooms are checked and sanitized no less often than every 4 hours.

Mandated Personal Protection Equipment

All staff are required to wear face protection and gloves when working in areas occupied by guests. Staff must wash their hands every time gloves are removed. All guests, crew and staff are required by the State of Michigan to wear face protection at all times when they are inside any area of the theater complex and until they exit the complex to the street and parking lots.

Social Distancing Procedures for Entering and Exiting the BCPA

Guests arriving for an event are required to remain outside the theater complex until it is time to seat. Ushers and staff will guide guests to theater doors using specific paths designed to promote social distancing and safe movement within spaces. Guests may not loiter in theater spaces. Once a performance ends, guests must exit the complex using the specifically designed paths and directly to the parking lot areas. No one may loiter in the lobby or other areas to wait for cast, crew or other guests.

Ticketing and Seating

Our ticketing website has been modified to allow people living together to sit together. We strongly encourage only those people who live together to sit together to prohibit the transfer of COVID. These groups will have an area of at least 6 feet around them with no other guests in seats. All other guests will be issued seats that have at least 6 feet of distance to any other guests. These procedures are designed to promote a safe event and rely on guests following rules. All guests must keep face protection in place when in their seats. Guests who fail to use face protection will be respectfully asked

to leave the BCPA complex. Note that using a ticket to enter the BCPA complex for any event assumes the ticket user accepts our policies and agrees to abide by them.

COVID Symptom Monitoring

At this time, we will not monitor every person entering the BCPA complex for elevated temperature or other symptoms. Any guest who has an elevated temperature (i.e. fever), cough, chills, sore throat, respiratory distress or other reported symptoms of COVID-19 may not enter the building in the interest of protecting all other persons.

All entities using BAS facilities agree to abide by the policies and guidelines of BAS as well as any Executive Orders, CDC recommendations, MHSAA guidelines, or local ordinances pertaining to COVID-19
